Digital Learning

The Digital Learning Programme has had a busy half-term working directly with schools in the Trust as well as reaching out wider to schools and a variety of industry partners.

**EHLT Training** 

We were delighted to host Smart Technologies for Trust training. The Trust EdTech Leads from all schools came together in the new (very delightful!) training room at Elston Hall to find out how they can make further use of the software already available, to explore further opportunities and to discuss the future both within Smart and within each school.

The Digital Learning Programme were asked to meet directly with the DfE on the 9th of November to discuss a self-review framework created by the DfE, that may provide direct support to schools in the future.

On the 17th November the Digital Learning Programme represented the Trust at the EdTech Summit held at Birmingham where networking with other schools and industry partners took place.

Having worked closely with us for 3 years, the Digital Learning Programme proudly showcased Yew Tree Primary School, Sandwell to colleagues from Taipei. This took place on 23rd November and was supported by the company View Sonic who are eager to share strong leadership of EdTech across a wider audience.

On Friday the 2nd of December the Digital Learning Programme team were invited to Microsoft Headquarters in Reading, to present to the UK Showcase and Incubator Schools as part of the UK Microsoft Summit. The presentation shared the journey of moving from one device to having one-to-one device usage within a school. The demand for the presentation was so high that the team ended up presenting it three times to different breakout groups.

On Monday the 5th of December the Digital Learning Programme team were asked by Microsoft, in partnership with Tablet Academy, to present at Charlton secondary school in Shropshire. The focus of this presentation was to share the benefits of becoming a Microsoft Showcase school, the journey to becoming a Microsoft Innovative Educator Expert (MIEE) and also how to start the journey by becoming a Microsoft Innovative Educator (MIE). This presentation was warmly received with several primary schools asking for further details about how they can access our support.

On Tuesday the 6th December the Digital Learning Programme was asked to be part of a keynote presentation at the Westminster Education Forum. The focus of the discussion was to discuss the next steps for EdTech in England. Lord Vaizey of Didcot, Khalid Mahmood MP and Bridie Tooher, Deputy Director, Digital Strategy for Education, Department for Education were also present and shared their thoughts on the topic.

EHLT maintains a Microsoft Showcase school as Pheasey has been awarded the status for a second year.
